ALL BOWLERS WHO PARTICIPATE IN THE FINAL ROUND WILL BE PAID.

**If more than 85 entries, the guarantees increase accordingly.

**If more than 105 entries, exactly 1 in 10 will be paid.

**Exactly 1 in 10 entries will earn qualifying spots in the 2025 Dudek End-of-Season Playoffs, unless all finalists have not yet qualified. Tournament Sanction Fee (8% of 1st Place) will be subtracted from Prize Fund (maximum of \$80.00).

THERE WILL BE THREE (3) OPTIONAL POOLS RUN DURING THIS EVENT: SCRATCH POOL — \$5.00 Per Entry

Four (4) games total pinfall without handicap to determine winners. All monies collected for this pool will be paid out: 1^{st} : 50%, 2^{nd} : 25%, 3^{rd} : 15%, 4^{th} : 10%.

HIGH SINGLE POOL — \$2.00 Per Entry

Scratch and handicapped high single games will be paid. A bowler can win only one (1) prize per entry. All monies collected for this pool will be paid out. The number of winners and the amount of each prize is based on the number of entries.

DOUBLES POOL — \$6.00 Per Team

Both members of a team must bowl on the same shift. Each bowler takes his or her best three games of the tournament. Handicap will be 80% based on a 300 average limit. A bowler can enter only once each time they bowl in the tournament. All monies collected for this pool will be paid out: 1st: 50%, 2nd: 30%, 3rd: 20%.

RHODE ISLAND CLASSIC TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. A bowler's entrance average will be the same as stated in the 2024-2025 Dudek Lanes Tournament Events flyer.
- 2. A bowler may re-enter as many times as they want, but cannot qualify more than once for the Final Round.

RHODE ISLAND CLASSIC TOURNAMENT FORMATS

QUALIFYING ROUNDS: The Qualifying Round consists of four (4) games. Handicap is 80% based on 160 average limit. Total pinfall plus handicap will determine the order of finish, with ties being broken using highest game(s) over average, if necessary.

FINAL ROUND:

Format 1 (65 Entries or Less)

The top six (6) finishers in the Qualifying Round will bowl in the Final Round. The 1^{st} and 2^{nd} place finishers earn a "bye" into the double-elimination match play finals of this event. The 3^{rd} , 4^{th} , 5^{th} , and 6^{th} place finishers will bowl two games. The total of their Qualifying Round score and their scores of these two games will determine the order of finish. The top two scores will move on to match play and will be 3^{rd} and 4^{th} seeds. The other two bowlers will be the 5^{th} and 6^{th} place finishers of the tournament. Ties will be broken using high single game over average during the Qualifying or Final Rounds,

Match Play:

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Round 1 – Match 1: 1 vs 4 Round 2 – Match 3: Winner Match 1 vs Winner Match 2 Match 2: 2 vs 3 Match 4: Loser Match 1 vs Loser Match 2**

**Loser eliminated – 4<sup>th</sup> place
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Round 3 – Match 5 (Semi-Finals): Loser Match 3 vs Winner Match 4^{**} **Loser eliminated – 3^{rd} place
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Round 4 – Match 6 (Finals): Winner Match 5 vs Winner Match 3 (Winner Match 5 must win two games)

Format 2 (66 to 85 Entries)

The top eight (8) finishers in the Qualifying Round will bowl in the double-elimination match play Final Round.

Match Play:

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Round 1 – Match 1: 1 vs 8 Round 2 – Match 5: Winner Match 1 vs Winner Match 4

Match 2: 2 vs 7 Match 6: Winner Match 2 vs Winner Match 3

Match 3: 3 vs 6 Match 7: Loser Match 1 vs Loser Match 4**

Match 4: 4 vs 5 Match 8: Loser Match 2 vs Loser Match 3**

(Winner Match 5 & 6 receive a "bye" to the Quarter-Finals)

** Losers (2) eliminated – 7<sup>th</sup> place
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Round 3 – Match 9: Loser Match 5 vs Loser Match 6**
Match 10: Winner Match 7 vs Winner Match 8**

**Losers (2) eliminated – 5<sup>th</sup> place
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Round 4 (Quarter-Finals) – Match 11: Winner Match 5 vs Winner Match 6
Match 12: Winner Match 9 vs Winner Match 10**
(Winner Match 11 receives a "bye" to the Finals)

**Loser eliminated – 4<sup>th</sup> place
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Round 5 (Semi-Finals) – Match 13: Loser Match 11 vs Winner Match 12** **Loser eliminated – 3^{rd} place

Round 6 (Finals) – Match 14: Winner Match 13 vs Winner Match 11 (Winner Match 13 must win two games)

Format 3 (86 to 105 Entries)

The top ten (10) finishers in the Qualifying Round will bowl in the Final Round. The 1^{st} through 6^{th} place finishers earn a "bye" into the double-elimination match play finals of this event. The 7^{th} , 8^{th} , 9^{th} , and 10^{th} place finishers will bowl two games. The total of their Qualifying Round score and their scores of these two games will determine the order of finish. The top two scores will move on to match play and will be 7^{th} and 8^{th} seeds. The other two bowlers will be the 9^{th} and 10^{th} place finishers of the tournament. Ties will be broken using high single game over average during the Qualifying or Final Rounds.

The eight (8) bowlers remaining will bowl in the double-elimination match play Final Round, using Format 2 above.
